Terms and Conditions of Bray Hunt Pony Club Bursary

- Member's must apply through It's Plain Sailing by 31st May there is no fee. (Application includes: Name, Membership number, Age, Parental Consent, Preferred Bursary, Pony/Horse details).
- Each member who applies must state their preferred Bursary option. Only one winner per bursary.
- There are no stipulations regarding age, rally attendance or tests achieved.
- It is very important that each Bursary is completed within the timeframe allocated: Laura Glynn and Sally Corscadden Bursaries July 17th to September 30th 2023.

Anne Marie Dunphy Bursary - August 1st to September 30th 2023. • If a Bursary cannot be taken up within the timeframe stated, and all reasonable efforts have been made to accommodate the winner, it is only fair to pass the Bursary on to the next member in line.

- The show attended for the Anne Marie Dunphy Bursary is to be identified and mutually agreed between Anne Marie Dunphy and the bursary recipient and a show that Anne Marie Dunphy is already attending herself.
- The competition attended for the Laura Glynn Bursary is to be identified and mutually agreed between Laura Glynn and the bursary recipient and one held at Killossery Lodge Stud, Swords, Co. Dublin.
- The competition for the Sally Corscadden is to be identified and mutually agreed between the bursary recipient and Sally Corscadden and is to be in the Leinster region.
- The Bursary is intended for the winner to do on their own horse/pony which they ride regularly and at Pony Club activities.
- The pony/horse used by the bursary recipient is to be the one named on their It's Plain Sailing expression of interest form and their 'Bursary Applicant Section One - Commitment and Dedication' form. Equally the same pony/horse is to be named on both forms!
- The named pony/horse cannot be changed unless under exceptional circumstances and by agreement of the judges.
- The pony/horse used must be in good condition, fit and sound to attend the Bursary.

- Each Bursary, as outlined, is paid for by BHPC. All expenses outside of this description must be paid for by the winner for example; their transport, competition fees, coach's fuel costs/expenses outside of what the bursary details.
- Section One: Commitment and Dedication is focused on Rally Attendance,
 Tack & Turnout and Horsemanship at each rally.
- Each rally attended is awarded 5 points.
- Tack & Turnout, Horsemanship are awarded 5 points each per rally, at the instructor's discretion, if the desired criteria is reached.
- Tack & Turnout, Horsemanship are awarded 0 points each per rally if the desired criteria is not reached.
- Section Two: Sportsmanship and IPC Ethos -will be assessed by the applicant's Camp Instructor at the relevant camp Bray Junior/Senior Camp or Area 1 'B-Test' Camp.
- Section Two: Sportsmanship is marked out of 10 points and the IPC Ethos is marked out of 10 points - giving a combined total for Section Two out of 20 points.
- Section Three: Letter of Aspiration; a letter of no more than 100 words, must be; solely and independently composed and written by the applicant, witnessed and signed off by their parent, and handed in to the DC on the first day of Bray Pony Club Pony Camp or Area 1 'B-Test' Camp, as appropriate, along with their completed 'Bursary Applicant Section One -Commitment and Dedication' form.
- Section Three: Letter of Aspiration is assessed by the Judges. Section Three: Letter of Aspiration is marked out of 50 points. The points from all three sections are added together to give a total out of 145 points. There cannot be more than 145 points
- awarded. There are no negative points or penalties awarded.
- In the event of a tie the applicant with the highest Section Three points shall be deemed the winner. If there is a further tie the applicants names shall be put in a hat and one winner drawn at random.
- The judges decision is complete and final.
- No canvassing of the instructors, judges or any BHPC official or committee member is allowed nor will it be tolerated.
